

Wyandotte Pregnancy Clinic Inc. is committed to protecting your privacy and ensuring the confidentiality of your personal health information. This Privacy Policy outlines how we collect, use, and protect your health information in accordance with both federal and state laws.

Information We Collect: We collect and maintain personal health information (PHI) to provide medical care and services. This includes:

- **Personal Identification Information:** Name, address, phone number, email, date of birth, and emergency contact details.
- **Health Information:** Medical history, diagnoses, treatment plans, prescriptions, test results, and other clinical information.

How We Use Your Information: We use your health information for various purposes, including but not limited to:

- Providing medical treatment and care.
- Coordinating care with other healthcare providers.
- Complying with federal and state laws, regulations, and industry standards.
- Conducting quality assurance activities and improving patient care.

- **Notification of Data Breaches:** In the event of a data breach involving your personal health information, we will notify you as required by Kansas law within 30 days of discovering the breach.
- **Data Retention:** We retain your health information in compliance with Kansas regulations.
- **Data Disposal:** When no longer needed, your personal health information will be securely destroyed to prevent unauthorized access.

Your Rights Regarding Your Health Information: You have the right to:

- **Access Your Health Information:** You may request to review or obtain a copy of your health records. We may charge a fee for copying and sending your records.
- **Request Corrections:** If you believe that any information in your records is incorrect or incomplete, you may request an amendment to your health records.
- **Limit or Restrict Uses and Disclosures:** You can request restrictions on how your information is used or disclosed, though we are not required to agree to all requests.

- **Receive Confidential Communications:** You may request that we communicate with you about health matters in a certain way (e.g., by email or at a different address).
- **Opt-Out of Marketing:** You may opt out of receiving marketing materials or disclosures of your information for non-treatment purposes.

Third-Party Sharing: We will not share your personal health information with third parties for marketing purposes without your explicit consent. However, we may disclose your information to third-party vendors or service providers to assist in the operations of the clinics (e.g., billing, laboratory testing, etc.), as necessary and in compliance with applicable privacy laws.

Employee Training and Confidentiality: All employees and contractors at Wyandotte Pregnancy Clinic Inc. are trained on the importance of patient privacy and the proper handling of health information. They are required to adhere to strict confidentiality protocols. Violations of privacy policies or unauthorized access to patient information may result in disciplinary action, including termination.

Security of Your Information: We implement physical, technical, and administrative safeguards to protect your personal health information from unauthorized access, loss, or disclosure. This includes encryption of electronic health records and secure storage of paper records.
